Q. How many of the 6 are considered recovered?

A. We have one recovered individual in Carbon County.

Q. Is the recovered patient the first case we had?

A. Public Health has not released any information about who the recovered person is, only that there is someone who has recovered. They are pretty careful about releasing any kind of information that is possibly personal, especially in a county our size. If we get anything further, we can pass it along.

Q. Are the questions from last week answered and is there a link please?

A. To answer your question from last week - The ideal is surveillance testing, where everyone gets tested to determine if they currently have or have had the virus. We currently do not have the testing resources for that kind of testing. Criteria may change as more tests become available and more people will be able to get tested. It is difficult to determine at this point what the criteria for testing may become and how many more people in Montana will be able to take tests.

Q. Hearing there's 6 Clovis's (COVID) in the Roberts area. Is that true?

A. Thanks for the question. I am sorry I didn't see it during the live broadcast. As of this morning, there have been six positive COVID-19 tests in Carbon County. One has recovered, leaving 5 active cases. We know that COVID-19 has affected all of the Commissioner districts in the county (Red Lodge, Joliet and Bridger districts). The incident management team doesn't know in what specific communities these people reside.
