Where we are

- No Active Cases in Carbon County
- 3 Active Hospitalizations in the state
- Number of new cases statewide is low
- Ratio of active cases to test given is low around 1 active case in 1000 tests

Why are we doing all of this?



"First and foremost, people don't want to get sick and don't want to get others sick. Montanans understand that. The Governor is confident that most Montanans will take this directive seriously and understand their role in cutting off the chain of transmission to save lives and minimize long term impacts to our economy.



Why Phases are important

- We have to learn to live with this virus
- Allows us to look at the impact each step is having in our communities
- Allows for data driven decisions
- Takes time to see impact and get data
- Don't want to go backwards



Changes

- Stay at home order has been lifted for a little over 2 weeks (April 27)
 - Most vulnerable are still encouraged to stay home
- Businesses have been open for a little over 2 weeks (April 28)
- Restaurants, Bars, Breweries, etc. have been open for a little over a week (May 4)
- Gyms, Theaters, Pools will be open in a few days (May 15)
- People are moving around more, visitors are coming into the state
